May Meeting at Roxboro

Finally, a forecast for Carolinas Chapter monthly meeting that did not include low clouds. However it did have one unwelcome factor and that was wind...lots & lots of wind, due to a cold front coming through our area.

As my guest, Dave MacDonald, and I cranked up the Tri-Pacer and left Bradford Field we had a 15 kt. crosswind on takeoff with lots of moderate turbulence on climb out. However by the time we reached our cruising altitude of 5500 ft. we were having a reasonable smooth flight and because of the strong tailwind the GPS was showing nearly 140 mph ground speed..

As we neared Person county airport we were on top of a layer of scattered clouds and as we started our descent down through them we had to do some "S" turns to stay in the clear. The crosswind landing at KTDF was uneventful except for a few hard bumps on short final.

We were directed to parking on the back row of a large field full of vintage aircraft. As the VAA Chapter 3 Fly-in is a three day affair some of the aircraft had camping tents under their wings. One of the VAA 3 members doing the parking was CSWPC member **Jeff Anderson** from Lewisville, NC.

By the time we shut down and exited the plane thru Mr. Piper's single door we saw **Rich & Charlotte Netherby** of Wake Forest, NC and **Roger Hawkins** of Asheboro, NC walking up to greet us. It wasn't long before **Ryan & Brandy Montambo** along with **Andrew & Kira** landed in their Tri-Pacer to join us..

Also on hand were members **Gary & Judy Winter** from Apex, NC with their Vagabond and **Ron & Nancy Normark** along with their son **Jordan** from Raleigh, NC in their matching Super Cubs. **John & Beverly Barringer** from Kannapolis, NC were also there helping out with the fly-in.

As Dave and I left Person County the AWOS was reporting the wind at 16 kts. gusting to 23 kts. with a 50 degree right crosswind. On days like this I am glad to have the training wheel on the front end of the aircraft. Soon after takeoff we were joined by the Montambo family's Tri-Pacer for the slow, into the wind, flight back to Bradford. Even with the wind it was a great day to be flying.
